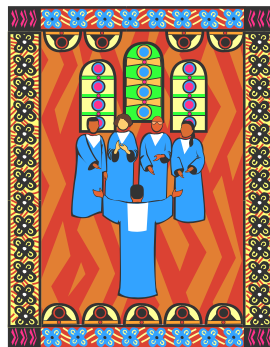

JANUARY MISSION OF THE MONTH: Koinonia Kupboard

The primary free food pantry for the Northern Door County area is housed at the First Baptist Church in Sister Bay, and is open for self-service from 9:00 am - 4:00 pm Tuesday through Thursday to anyone of any faith. Koinonia means “sharing or communion” in Greek. Sharing with neighbors is at the core of what the pantry stands for. The pantry is accepting nonperishable food items and personal care items like soaps, toothbrushes, toothpaste and monetary donations to purchase fresh food. Visitors are allowed to take up to two bags weekly of groceries for food assistance. Support for the pantry comes from many area churches, businesses, and social organizations. *Thanks so much for sharing your gifts!*
