Howard Williamson spent most of his 40 years as a teacher, counselor, director of guidance and GED/adult tutoring program supervisor with the Ritenour School District in suburban St. Louis, beginning in 1964, when it was the largest three-year high school in Missouri with an enrollment of more than 3,000.

He will be honored during homecoming weekend with a Lifetime Achievement Award from the district, becoming just the fifth non-Ritenour graduate to be named to its Hall of Fame since the program was established in 1997.
