Call to Worship:

M. The voice of the LORD is over the waters;

Prayer:

Lord, you have come to the lakeshore looking neither for wealthy nor wise ones; you only asked me to follow humbly. Lord, with your eyes you have searched me, and while smiling have spoken my name; now my boat's left on the shoreline behind me; by your side I will seek other seas.

Scripture: Isaiah 6:1-8, John 21:1-14

Message: You are changed. By Rev Steve Polster

The 8th century people of Jerusalem and Isaiah the prophet were in the midst of a precarious situation. The disciples of Jesus following his death and resurrection were in a precarious situation. And, so are we. A powerful Assyrian military is descending on a weak and unprepared Jerusalem. Destruction and exile are imminent. Jesus closest followers are back in Galilee wondering what just happened to them, to Jesus, to their faith, and plans for the future. And we are in the precarious situation of life in the midst of virus and unknown future.

Will fear determine our future? Will we just wait for what's next? I don't think so.

Isaiah said there is another response and so does Jesus. Yes we may feel overwhelmed by the Assyrians, by an absent Jesus, by anxiety about health and security, but through and by God's grace, our fear is changed to hope. We too may take courage to stand and be God's voice and presence, confident of God's power(not ours) we too can express, "Here am I. Send Me." When asked by Jesus, as was Peter, "Do you love me?" We too respond and feed his sheep.

After a life of empty nets and empty hearts Jesus says, "Breakfast is ready!" May we meet Jesus at the shore of our ordinary and everyday life to be nourished and warmed by the food of love and grace so we may, in turn, share love and grace with our world.

Response to the Word:

Take a piece of bread or cracker and a glass of grape juice, wine or water. Re-read the last paragraph. Now give thanks for a God who comes to us and brings to us a future with hope. Each person eats the bread or cracker and drinks the juice, wine or water. In silence commit yourself to share love and grace in the world around you.

Scripture Readings:

Isaiah 6 1:8

6 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ²Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³And they were calling to one another:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty;
the whole earth is full of his glory."

⁴At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

⁵"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty."

⁶Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."

⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"
And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

John 21:1-14

21 Afterward Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee.^[a] It happened this way: ²Simon Peter, Thomas (also known as Didymus^[b]), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. ³"I'm going out to fish," Simon Peter told them, and they said, "We'll go with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus.

⁵He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?"

"No," they answered.

⁶He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish.

⁷Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, "It is the Lord," he wrapped his outer garment around him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. ⁸The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred yards.^[c] ⁹When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread.

¹⁰Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught." ¹¹So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead.
