HYMN SING 30™ ANNIVERSARY

Mission Committee of the Zion United Methodist Church invite you, family, and friends to join us in an Old-Fashioned Hymn Sing on Sunday, July 9 at 5:00 pm. People of many denominations will gather in the little country church on County F to sing the beloved songs of faith. The Rev. Don Heeringa, former Zion Pastor, will be the song leader with Joan Vahey at the keyboard. Refreshments and fellowship follow the singing.

What began in 1993 as a simple community outreach effort has become a cherished tradition, attracting participants from at least thirteen different congregations. Moreover, the Hymn Sing has evolved into a phenomenal fund raiser. Apparently, people who love to sing hymns are generous, for over the years, this event has raised \$40,500, with 100% of the money going to Door County non-profit organizations.

This year the Zion Mission Committee has tapped **Door -Tran** as the recipient of the offerings. Door- Tran is a community network connecting people to transportation services that are affordable, available, and accessible, meeting the unmet transportation needs many of Door County residents.

We have seen Door-Tran in action. This organization provides more than rides and assistance with gas, repairs, the vehicle purchases. in addition to giving them mobility. Door-Tran staff and volunteers offer genuine respect and concern for the well-being of their clients. We feel privileged to be able to help them achieve their mission.
