

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR

Can God spread a table in the wilderness? - Psalm 78:19
A history teacher in High School said to our class "we study the past to understand the present and prepare for the future". In Psalm 78 the Psalmist is using the history of Israel and Judah to warn of a future that ignores their past. The psalmist is saying that both have forgotten the part of their history where God give them the necessities of life in the wilderness.

The wilderness was the geographic location that revealed the nature of God. God sustained the Hebrews in the wilderness until they reached the Promised Land. During their time in the wilderness, they learned to trust God and Gods' laws. They formed themselves into a nation that was to be the light of the world. From the time of the Exodus into the first Century the wilderness was the place that taught people about God and God's plan of salvation. John the Baptist brought people to the wilderness at the Jordan River to repent. It was in the wilderness outside of Jerusalem that Jesus was tempted by Satan to use His power for personal gain, and Paul went to the wilderness of Arabia for three years after his vision of Jesus on the Road to Damascus. In Mark, Jesus leads a group of Gentiles on a three-day preaching and teaching retreat into the wilderness. Instead of going to a retreat center with nice lodging and meals they went out into a desert place. Jesus is deeply touched by the response of the people following Him. The Gentiles believed and accepted that His healing and preaching was from God. At the end of the third day Jesus notices that they have ate all their food and that they were very far from any village where they might buy food. These people have come a long way physically and spiritually. Jesus does not want the transformative event from the last three days to be undone by hunger or worse, by showing little interest in their well-being. The Disciples rummage around and find some fish and bread. Jesus blesses the food, and all eat and are filled with plenty of left over. This is a story of Gods compassion not of the miracle of 4,000 being fed. Jesus does not use His power to create an elaborate feast but provides (as God did in the wilderness for the Hebrews) enough for them to have the strength to return to their homes. I believe it was the demonstration of Gods compassion that brought home all that Jesus was teaching, partially because I do not think all of the people realized that only seven loves and a few fish were used.. All they knew was that there was enough to feed each one and no one got more than another. Gods' power is fully experienced in God's love and compassion. Jesus gathered more followers through His compassion than through His teaching. We are in a wilderness time in our country and world. We will come out of this wilderness because of compassion. Compassion will give strength to those who are working to alleviate suffering and provide necessities of life for us. Compassion will give us the strength to be uncomfortable and do without for the health of others. While we are in this wilderness, we are developing tools and ways to be teachers, pastors, medical workers, servers, and doing jobs in ways that were never taught in school or workshops. Compassion will enable us to go through the wilderness together. God will add strength to our compassion to bring about healing.
